What to do before Conference | Book travel and accommodation

- Cardiff is the closest urban area to St Fagans with lots of hotels and other city amenities
- Many train routes go through the city's main train station,
 Cardiff Central. <u>Access information for this station</u> is available via the National Rail website
- You can find <u>discounts on train fares</u> and <u>preferential hotel</u> <u>rates</u> for delegates on our website



What to do before Conference | Register for Swapcard

- Swapcard is the digital platform and app for Conference 2025
- You can use it to browse the programme, plan your agenda and connect with other delegates
- Online delegates also use the platform to watch streamed sessions live



What to do before Conference | Register for Swapcard

- To use Swapcard you need to activate the magic link emailed to you from Swapcard
- Links expire after 48 hours
- Remember to use the same email address you used when you registered for Conference

- First Cymru 320 service stops in St Fagans village (about half a mile from the museum or approximately an 11-minute walk)


Exploring St Fagans: At a glance...


Additional information about the St Fagans site: At a glance

- St Fagans is a large open-air museum with many historical buildings, outdoor areas and modern facilities
- Due to the historic nature of the museum, there are uneven floors and surfaces. Some of the paths on the castle side of the museum are steep and uneven
- We recommend people explore the map of St Fagans via the QR code to the right and <u>online</u>
- The map has been also reproduced on the next slide
- Physical copies of the map will be available at the MA Help Desk and a digital version is available via the Swapcard app

Most Conference sessions take place in the Main Museum Building (number 1 on the <u>map</u>), including:


- Core Sessions in the Atrium

The Main Museum Building is also where you'll find:

- A paid cafe
- Relaxed networking area
- Accessible catering point



Guide to the St Fagans site: Atrium



- Core Sessions take place in the Atrium on the ground floor of the Main Museum Building
- This space has capacity for about 600 people and will be theatre style seating
- Sessions in this room are streamed for online delegates and recorded
- Sessions will be captioned




Guide to the St Fagans site: Lecture Theatre



- In Practice and Supporter
 Sessions take place in the
 Lecture Theatre on the first
 floor of the Main Museum
 Building
- This space has capacity for about 120 people and will be fixed theatre style seating
- Sessions in this room are streamed for online delegates and recorded
- Sessions will be captioned



Guide to the St Fagans site: Studio/Stiwdio 1



- Training Sessions take place in Studio/Stiwdio 1
- This space has capacity for about 60 people in theatre style seating
- Training sessions are repeated across day one and two to allow as many people as possible to attend
- Sessions are not recorded or streamed
- Sessions will be captioned



Guide to the St Fagans site: Studio/Stiwdio 2



- Breakout Sessions take place in Studio/Stiwdio 2
- This space has capacity for about 60 people in theatre style seating
- Welsh-to-English translation is provided in this room (where relevant)
- Sessions are not recorded or streamed
- Sessions will be captioned



Guide to the St Fagans site: Studio/Stiwdio 3



- Breakout Sessions take place in Studio/Stiwdio 3
- This space has capacity for about 100 people in theatre style seating
- Sessions are not recorded or streamed
- Sessions will be captioned
- Sponsored lunchtime sessions also take place in this room – lunch will be served for attending delegates



Guide to the St Fagans site: Temporary Exhibition Space

- Workshops take place in the Temporary Exhibition Space
- This space has capacity for about 100 people at round tables
- Sessions are not recorded or streamed
- Sessions will be captioned
- The networking session for the Neurodiverse Museum will also take place in this room





Guide to the St Fagans site: Catering and Exhibitor area



- Coffee and lunch will be served in a marquee, which can be entered at point 20 on the map.
- Please note that access to the marquee includes crossing a gravelled area of ground – a <u>photo is</u> available on our website
- We will also have a wide range of exhibitor tabletops in this area
- It is approximately a four-minute walk from the Main Museum Building
- Transporter buggies will be available to those who require it
- People can also request accessible lunch to be served within the cafe in the Main Museum Building (see slide 37)

Guide to the St Fagans site: Gweithdy



- The workshop at Gweithdy (number 32 on the map) will host some of our grassroot sector support networks meet-ups
- This building has step free access and toilet provision (including a Changing Places toilet)
- The workshop has a seated capacity of about 20 people
- There will be no AV provision in this space during Conference



Guide to the St Fagans site: The Vulcan Hotel Pub



- The back room of the Vulcan Hotel Pub (number 26 on the map) will also host some grassroot sector support networks meet-ups
- Please note that this is a historic building and may not be accessible for all. Internal photos are available on the next slide
- Alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks will be sold in the front room of the pub throughout Conference

Accessibility at Conference 2025

- All sessions taking place in the Main Museum Building will be captioned
- Sessions taking place in the Atrium and Lecture Theatre will be streamed and recorded
- Reserved seating in all rooms
- A dedicated quiet room for in-person delegates
- A prayer room for individuals to engage in prayer, reflection or quiet contemplation
- Wheelchair accessible coaches
- Accessible catering point (see slide 37)
- Assistance dogs welcomed
- Speakers are briefed to ensure that slides follow good accessibility guidance, based on advice from <u>VocalEyes</u>
- A trained mental health first-aider (Alice) will be available on the MA Help Desk
- Our Code of Conduct ensures our spaces are safe, welcoming and inclusive



Toilet provision at St Fagans

- The Main Museum Building has single-sex toilet blocks on the ground floor. Smaller single-sex toilet blocks are also available on the second floor (accessible by stairs and lift) outside the Lecture Theatre
- The Main Museum Building also has a Changing Places toilet on the ground floor.
- Gweithdy has single-sex toilets, a gender-neutral accessible toilet and a Changing Places toilet. Please note the accessible toilet is in the basement and accessed via a lift
- There are gender-neutral accessible toilets near Rhyd-y-car Terrace, in the castle grounds, and in Oakdale Workmen's Institute
- All toilets are marked on the <u>map of St Fagans</u>
